Proposals for Raising £200 for Xmas
Day festivities on the North Shields
Trawlers.

In response to the request of your Chairman and Secretary, I have considered ways and means of raising this sum of money (and more if possible), and my conclusions lead me to suggest a direct appeal to the residents of Dore & Totley.

Scope. In restricting the appeal to the people of Dore and Totley, I keep in mind the fact that your name has a purely local flavour even though the nature of the appeal is of national interest. Your name and work are becoming well known in the locality and I believe that very many residents who are too much occupied to take an active part in your efforts will readily support a local "do", to the extent of a subscription.

The Nature of the Appeal. In recent weeks, the B.B.C. have brought home to the public, by way of many moving and dramatic broadcasts, the perils and dangers of the sea. The Merchant Navy, and the Trawlers who sweep the seas they travel, have been big news. Evidence of how the hearts of the people have been touched was demonstrated in the spontaneous reaction of everyone to the recent broadcast by Seaman Laskier and by the wife of a merchant seaman. An appeal for the "men of the little ships" is, in my opinion, a winner from the start - so long as it is properly constructed and organised.

The Time to Appeal. It is necessary to get the amount raised in post to the C.O. Naval Base, North Shields in ample time for him to spend it before Xmas Day. I think that the cheque should reach him at least three weeks before the day. This means that the money must be collected during the last few days in November. The month end and the week-end are good times to appeal for money and the approaching season will also have its effect, one hopes. I suggest that the effort be made from November 24th to 29th inclusive.

The Form of the Appeal. I suggest that the appeal should be a straight request for subscriptions. The only expense will be notepaper and envelopes if the appeals are delivered by hand and the collections, similarly, are made in person. I will defray the cost of stationery and printing as my contribution to the effort.

I attach a suggested letter which sets out the purpose of the Appeal, asks for support and explains how the subscriptions will be collected.

If this letter is properly delivered to and read by all the residents of Dore and Totley, it is reasonable to assume that a satisfactory proportion will be prompted to put a subscription in the small envelope provided. It is, therefore, of great importance that every appeal letter be followed up by a visit (or even two visits) to secure the contribution.

Organisation. The details which need to be arranged are:-

- (1) A mailing list of all Dore and Totley residents.
- (2) Addressing the envelopes
- (3) Printing the appeal letter
- (4) Making up the letter packets.
- (5) Appointment of district organisers to supervise and control the delivery and collection of letters and subscriptions.
- (6) Arrangements for receiving and opening subscription envelopes from all district organisers.

Mailing List. A complete list of all houses in Dore and Totley is being made available to me.

Addressing Envelopes. I can arrange for this to be done within the next few days.

Printing. I can arrange for this to be done as soon as it is known that you are a Registered Charity.

Making up letters. This is an afternoon's work for a dozen or so of your knitters. I am sure that you can arrange this.

District Organisers. The area of Dore and Totley should be divided into, say, twelve districts so that all districts involve approximately the same amount of walking time to deliver the Appeals. For each district you will need a volunteer organiser who will undertake with the help of friends and their maids (if any), to deliver the letter packets to every house in each district on Monday or Tuesday, November 24th or 25th, and no later. Each organiser to be provided with:-

- (a) A list of roads and house numbers
- (b) The appropriate bundles of letter packets held together in proper sequence by elastic bands.

It is expected that the lists and letter packets can be get ready to hand to district organisers by Wednesday the 19th November. Prior to that date organisers can be acquainted of the roads which comprise their districts to give them the opportunity to make their delivery and collection arrangements. District organisers will similarly undertake to organise the collection of the subscription envelopes. All organisers to be provided with a supply of official badges for their collectors to wear. Collections should be made on Friday and Saturday November 26th and 27th.

Receiving, opening and counting subscriptions.

All district organisers should bring in subscription envelopes to Brook Hall on the afternoon of Monday, December 1st, where the Treasurer will open and count the district subscriptions. The result can be announced to that day's meeting. A cheque can be sent to Capt. Shadwell the following day.

Supplementary. In addition to the residents of Dore and Totley, it is suggested that the Appeal Letter can be posted, with a personal note, by members of the group to their friends in other parts of Sheffield. This would produce a few cheques and postal orders. A few copies of the Appeal letter may be obtained by any member for this purpose.
