D & T. M.S.T.C.F.

Control of Funds.

- 1) The Association having applied to be registered under the War Charities Act, 1940, must comply with the Regulations in that act, governing the handling of moneys received.
- 2) The funds must be controlled by a duly appointed officer of the association and subject to certification by a qualified accountant. Mrs. Grayson is Secretary and Treasurer and Mr. Bedingfield Chartered Accountant, has undertaken to be honourary auditor.
- 3) All moneys received by the association or by groups affiliated to the association must be banked without any deduction whatsoever in the common account of the fund at Williams Deacons Bank Ltd., Church Street, Sheffield. This is to ensure that the total gross revenue is duly accounted for before any expenses are met, as the ratio of expenses to gross income is closely scrutinised in the audited accounts.
- 4) All payments out of the fund for the purpose of wool, comforts and running expenses must be duly recorded and it is advisable to pay these by cheque out of the common fund controlled by Mrs. Grayson and the committee.
- 5) It is desired that the fund shall not be charged at any time with out-of-pocket or running expenses, and up to date no sums have been so charged. All the expenses of the fete, weekly meetings and other functions have been met out of the pockets of members or by gifts from friends for that specific purpose.
- 6) If it is not possible always to meet expenses out of the pockets of members, then such expenses will be paid by the treasurer out of the common funds against a receipted voucher.
- 7) For this purpose the treasurer will keep a petty cash float by drawing the necessary amount from the bank, and affiliated groups will be provided with a subsidiary petty cash float on application to the treasurer.
- 8) The treasurer of ^{an} affiliated group will be responsible for the group petty cash float, and will account to Mrs. Grayson for all disbursements from it. Mrs. Grayson will reimburse group floats as money is spent.
- 9) All other amounts incurred by groups which are not capable of being met out of group petty cash floats should be certified for payment by group committees and then

referred to the main committee for payment out of the common ~~banking~~ *banking* account.

- 10) Each group treasurer should keep a petty cash book in which should be entered all petty cash floats received from Mrs. Grayson, and all amounts paid out by way of expenses and other items, and these group petty cash books will be required by the auditor at the year end.
- 11) Groups may pay such funds and income as they receive ~~either~~ either to Mrs. Grayson for her to bank, or they may bank them direct, but in this case a copy of the pay-in slip must be sent to Mrs. Grayson for book-keeping purposes.
- 12) If groups receive contributions in kind (gifts of comforts, wool &c) from any source, these should be duly notified to Mrs. Grayson who will arrange for their disposal with the group liaison officer.

REPORT OF ACTIVITIES FROM NOVEMBER 1st to week ending NOVEMBER 30th

The Group has made a good start. 125½ lbs. of wool have been received from Mrs. Grayson, 91 lbs. of which have been given out to Knitters. The following Garments have been sent in to the D & T. M.S.T & C.F.:-

21 Jerseys. 18 Seaboot Stockings. 19 Socks. 18 scarves. 10 Gloves.
4 Helmet. 2 Mittens.

We have 34 regular Knitters on our books. This number will soon be considerably increased as the Fulwood First Aid Post has decided to knit for the "Sunshine" Group.

On November 6th the Soroptomists very kindly held a Whist Drive in aid of our Funds at the Sunshine Cafe. We wish to thank the Dore & Totley Ladies who took tickets for this Whist Drive. We should also like to point out that the Committee of Sunshine Trawlers had nothing to do with the organisation of the Whist Drive, except for giving prizes. No Report of the proceeds has been received by our Treasurer.

An excellent Lecture was given by Mrs. Thompson of York on "Knitting for Seamen - Stitches & Stories" at the Y.W.C.A. on November 21st. She charged us no Fee, all her expenses were paid by a Wellwisher, to whom we express our thanks, as we also do to T. Bookless Esq. who very generously put a Public Notice in the Sheffield Telegraph for us. £4.10.0. Ticket Money was handed in to the Treasurer.

A small Knitting Party is held every Monday at 18 Ranmoor Cliffe Road, where sales of cakes and vegetables have brought in over £2 during the month.

At the Sunshine Cafe a small Christmas Tree has proved a great success on Wednesday afternoons, £4.10.0. being made on Nov. 19th and £7.10.0. on the 26th November. Unfortunately saleable gifts are

now exhausted and we shall have to lay out some of the money made by the tree, in purchases, in order to make a small profit on December 17th and Christmas Eve when the ~~xxx~~ Tree will be displayed in the Cafe. We hope to have a Collection Box on Xmas Eve. We are therefore including the Christmas Tree Profit in the Treasurer's Statement next month.

Dear Mrs Grayson

Mrs Wass gave me your letter dated April 3rd to read yesterday. Our people were thrilled with the letter from the Chaplain and I am sure will re-double their efforts.

There seemed, however, to be a feeling of great disappointment at the news that no big effort was being undertaken by Dore and Totley this Summer. I suppose this is unavoidable, but I feel that interest will fall off and also funds and workers, if constant efforts are not made. It is one of the curiosities of Sheffield and district that nothing lasts more than two and a half years, I don't know whether you have noticed this? I myself shall be leaving (D.V.) in July, as we have got possession of our Cotswold cottage and if we can't sell this house shall let it. I have told no-one but Mrs Wass, as it will be better for the Wednesday Knitting Party if I just depart, of course they will see that the house is up for sale later.

There seemed an idea that perhaps your side was going to pack up? I said I was sure you were not going to do this.

The idea of a Meeting which you mentioned was really, I think, more a suggestion that some sort of an entertainment might be arranged through our joint efforts in the Summer with Admiral Lyne as the chief attraction, in a good long talk about the Mine Sweepers. Couldn't this be done somehow? I was wondering if Genefax could be persuaded to let us have it there as it is so easy to get at, and I think they have a canteen and a big room. If there was any trouble with the Board I could write to Lady Mathews and ask her to pull her weight with Sir Ronald who has always been awfully good to me about these things, but I know she never comes to Sheffield now, and is so upset about the poor boy that I don't want to bother either of them if it could be avoided.

Someone else thought of the Abbeydale Picture House which it appears we could get for an afternoon...this would be all right if people would turn up for an indoor show in the Summer...I doubt it.

I think you can be certain of ten pounds a month till December, after that I have my doubts again.

If you can't do anything, perhaps we could persuade the Admiral to give the Chaplain leave, and let him address a small Meeting at the Y.M.C.A. or equal... I do want to leave Sunshine Trawlers solvent and enthusiastic.

Please excuse mistakes. have just finished an enormous Wash, am soaked to skin and all over scalds!!
