Dear Commissioner,

I have received your letter of the 24th December, and thank you for news of the information received from IHQ. It was my intention to write to you straight away but unfortunately I have been on the sick list.

I note that you have written to IHQ, and thank you for taking up this matter on our behalf.

There are several points which I should like to mention as I think they help in understanding the action we have had to take so far.

at the prisoner of war camp, we proceeded to get advice as to the condition of one wooden but in which we were interested, when we were informed that we should be required to tender to the Ministry of Works for a block of buts comprising the one in which we were interested; another similar wooden but; four Nashcrete buts of similar size; and several brick out-buildings. We had to decide within a day and a half whether we should tender, or whether we should allow the block to go with the rest of the camp for open tender. The question was, whether we should seize the opportunity of getting a headquarters of our own, or whether we should let it slip by. If the block had gone

to open tender we should not have been able to secure it, and I doubt whether comparable huts will be available for some time.

Our tender was accepted on the understanding that the site was cleared within a fortnight. Of course, it was impossible for us to do this, and we have many to secure an extension.

Of the five contractors whom we asked to tender for demolition and removal of the huts, four would not quote, either because they were already too busy, or because they were unable to make a firm offer for the work. The fifth is a local builder who is interested in the Scouts. His original quotation was £495 but after we discussed the matter fully with him he agreed to undertake the work for a maximum figure of £400 on the understanding that he had assistance from older Scouts, Scouters and friends wherever possible.

The work to which we are actually committed is the minimum, bearing in mind our financial resources and at the same time the necessity of our having some meeting place as soon as possible. It represents demolition of the huts, removal to our site, new foundations, and re-erection of the shell of our headquarters. Further work, such as internal boarding and partitioning will depend on the money we have available. As I mentioned in the letter to IHQ, we have so far not provided for fencing; heating; lighting; water; drainage; w.c's; and furnishing, and it will be a very great help if an application for a grant for this work will receive favourable consideration.

I did mention before that we have been given to understand by the Education Authority that they will be prepared to assistem with equipment only, and not with the structure. No official application has, of course, yet been made.

I realize that there are rules and regulations in the matter of grants, but I feel no doubt that if we had let the opportunity of purchasing these buts slip by, we should now have had no prospect of a headquarters, and that, when our use of the room at Totley Hall is stopped we should have had nowhere for our two Packs and the junior and Senior Troops to meet.

We do not know how long it will be before we are turned out of Totley Hall, but our stay there has been very far from satisfactory for many months. Owing to the work which is being done in and about the Hall we have had no electric light/for some time, and have had to rely on candles and oil lamps. The workmen have had to be given access to our den, and consequently our Group equipment (tents, etc.,) is exposed to the danger of theft.

It was anticipated that work on the Hall would be finished several months ago, but fortunately for us it is not yet complete. We have tried to find other accommodation but that is practically impossible, and a place of our own seems the only alternative to a wholesale upset and reduction in our activities.

If hope that IHQ will be able to give favourable consideration to our case, and I shall be pleased to hear further when they write to you.

Dear Commissioner,

As promised I enclose a copy of the lotter written to you by IHQ. I find that I returned the original of this letter to you with my letter of the 5th January.

I gather that the reason Mr Codd wrote to IHQ is that he is anxious if possible to obtain assistance with the purchase and erection of the huts, rather than for the additional work which we have not yet undertaken. At the same time certain of this additional work will have to be going ahead before very long (for instance, it has already been necessary for us to arrange for water to be laid on the site) and he wishes to avoid the possibility of IHQ telling us that we have gone ahead again without permission.

The position is:

1. That we were forced to make the decision to tender for the Huts at a day-and-a-half's notice, or lose the possibility of getting a Headquarters in the foreseeable future.

3. The urgency with which we had to make arrangements for the removal of the Huts from their old site, and the equal urgency with which we must provide ourselves with a Headquarters, made us push ahead with the job at great speed.

3. Mr Codd, apparently, in his letter to IHQ accused me of delay in writing to them, but I must say that I am not aware that I have been responsible for any delay. At the same time I agree with you that any impression at

IHQ that we are "squabbling amongst ourselves" does not help our case at all. As a matter of fact we are working together very well, and I think Hr Codd's letter is evidence of over-anxiety to see the job finished and paid for. There is no doubt that he is putting a very great deal of work into this project, and we are all most anxious and concerned to get a suitable place for the boys to meet with the minimum of delay. As an indication of the amount of energy we are putting into this job, I may say that we have now put in a total of 580 hours voluntary labouring on the demolition of the huts.

If there is any further information which you would like to have, I am sure Aubryy would be willing to contact me if you telephone him, and then I would be able to ring you up.

REPORT ON NEW HEADQUARTERS BUILDING IN TOTLEY HALL LANG M. Second

- THE HUTS PURCHASAD The block of buildings purchased from the Ministry of Works comprised the following:
 - 2 wooden huts (35' x 16')

2 Nasherete hats with wooden roofs (36' x 16')

2 Nashcrete hats with wooden roofs which had been joined together by a connecting section to form a building approximately 36' x 40'

1 Terra-cotta block but with asbestos roof (30' x 18%')

and several brick out-buildings.

We were required to demolish the buildings and clear them from the site.

Our plan was to re-erect for our own use at Totley, the following:

1 Nashcrete but (24' x 16') from the best of the Nashcrete blocks, and to divide this by internal brick walls into smaller rooms, kitchen, lavatory, etc. The two buildings to be connected by a brick passage-way.

We entered into a contract with a small local builder to undertake the demolition and re-erection, but it was part of the contract that we should provide as much voluntary help as possible.

The buildings have now been demolished. 2. DEMOLITION This was achieved largely by voluntary labour.

Two bits and some surplus materials have been sold.

Materials required for re-erection were transported to our site at Totley. Some of the transport had to be paid for, but some was done on a voluntary basis. In addition to the wooden but and Masherete blocks; windows, doors and bricks were transported.

3. RE-ERECTION

(a) At Totley, the brick foundations have been laid, and filled with hard-core. (Owing to the slope of the site the foundations are four feet high at the lower end.) Dressed bricks salvaged from the demolition have been used in this work.

- (b) Both the wooden but and the Nasherete but have been erected, and both have been roofed and felted.
- (c) The laying of concrete floors is almost complete.
- (d) The wooden but has been completely creosoted.
- (e) Water has been laid to the boundary of the site.
- (f) Concrete fencing posts have been erected.

4. WORK STILL TO BE DONE

- (a) Completion of the concrete floors.
- (b) Building the connecting brick passage-way between the buts.
- (c) Erection of internal brick partitioning walls, doors, etc.

 (For both (b) and (c) dressed bricks salvaged from the demolition will be used as far as possible.)
 - (d) Painting of the Nashcrete but to match the wooden but (this is required by the Lease).
 - (e) Laying water supply from the boundary to the but (approx. 20 yards).
 - (f) Equipment in kitchen and lavatory, and connecting to main drain which runs across our site.
 - (g) Laying on gas (approximately 20 yards).
 - (h) Electric lighting.
 - (1) Paths and layout of land (approximately 650/yards) with shrubs, etc. (this is required by the lease). Erection of gates.

- (j) Lining of hats internally with plaster-board.
- (k) Chairs and other internal equipment.

5. THE SITE

Development Charge The question as to whether Development Charge is payable has not yet been settled, but there is a strong possibility that there will be no charge as Sheffield Corporation

has submitted an application under Section 82 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, which, if successful, will mean no charge is payable. In the meantime we have permission from the Central Land Board to carry on with the project pending a settlement. If Development Charge is ultimately payable we have been assured that it will be somewhere in the region of £30 to £40.

Lease We have entered into a Lease with Sheffield Corporation for ten years at a nominal rental of £1 per annum. The Group Scoutmaster and the Group Treasurer have been appointed trustees for the purpose of entering into this Lease. The Lease is dated 3rd March 1950.

6. FINANCE The Prisoner of War Camp at Redmires from which we purchased the huts involves a journey of approximately ten miles from Totley and, as has already been mentioned, the bulk of the work of demolition was done by voluntary labour. The hours of voluntary labour so far put into the project (demolition and re-erection) is 1260 hours.

Attached is a statement of the cost of the project to 31st March 1950. It will be seen that the cost is £311.2.11. A very approximate estimate of the further cost is £140 to cover This is based on the the items mentioned in paragraph 4 above. use of voluntary labour wherever possible.

We have been informed that the Local Education Committee will not help towards the cost of the structure, but possibily will help with the provision of equipment.

The huts were insured before demolition began, and we have arranged for the insurance to be continued for £400.

within a matter of a few pounds we have now come to the end of the money which we had in hand.

7. Owing to the fact that the temporary headquarters which we have had in Totley Hall is now being used by workmen employed on the re-construction of the Hall for the Sheffield Corporation it is completely unsuitable for Scout purposes, and it is very necessary, therefore, that we make use of our new headquarters at the earliest possible moment. We hope that we shall be able to make limited use of it by the end of this month.

If it is desired to proceed with the matter, the following resolutions must be passed at a meeting of the Local Association or of its Executive Committee, or, in the case of a Group, of the Group Committee:-

- (1) That the property of the Local Association (Group) described in the Schedule to a draft Trust Deed produced to the meeting shall be vested in Trustees and be held by them upon the Trusts declared in the said draft.
- (2) That shall be the first Trustees and shall forthwith execute a Trust Deed in the terms of the said draft.

The draft Deed must then be completed by inserting the following particulars:-

- (1) Full Christian names, surnames, addresses, and occupations of the proposed Trustees.
- (2) The full registered title of the Local Association or Group.
- (3) The date and nature of the meeting at which the resolutions were passed.
- (4) The Schedule of the Trust Deed should be filled in, but the inventory of equipment need not be sent with the Deed.

The draft Deed must then be sent to our Solicitors - Messrs Longbourne, Stevens & Powell, ?, Lincolns Inn Fields, London, W.C.2. If any building is included in the Schedule, there must be a statement as to whether it is moveable or immoveable, and in the latter case, a copy of the conveyance or lease of the land must also be sent to our Solicitors.

Our Solicitors will then send a special copy of the Deed for signature by the Trustees and will, at the same time, return any documents which have been sent to them. After signature by the Trustees, the Deed must be returned to our Solicitors for stamping, together with the sum of £l., being 10/- for stamp duty on the Deed and 10/- to cover their charge in the matter.

CUSTODY OF DEEDS.

A number of requests have been received that I.H.Q. should undertake the custody of deeds relating to Scout property.

Arrangements have now been made to offer this service for the Movement, and deeds will be accepted for safe custody without charge, subject to the following conditions.

- 1. Deeds will only be accepted where there is a properly constituted trust of land, investments, or a hut. Deeds will not be accepted in cases in which Scout equipment is the only property.
- The trust deed and the deeds of the title of the property subject
 to the trust only will be accepted. Policies of insurance and other
 documents relating to the management of the property must be
 kept locally, and a copy should also be kept of any schedule of
 property attached to a trust deed.
- 3. The deeds must be sent by registered post, and the package must be addressed to the Legal Secretary, The Boy Scouts Association, Imperial Headquarters, 25, Buckingham Palace Road, London, S.W.1. A letter signed by, and showing the position of, the person making the deposit must be enclosed: and this letter should state the number of documents sent.
- 4. Deeds so deposited will only be delivered up by I.H.Q. on a request signed by the person who deposited them, or on a request signed by all the Trustees.
- 5. I.H.Q. will take all reasonable precautions for the safety of deeds so deposited, but will not otherwise accept any responsibility.

GROUP PROPERTY.

(Memorandum circulated with P.O.R. October 1938.

Scouters in charge of Groups are reminded of the very great importance of ensuring that proper arrangements are made for the safety of the property of the Group and of providing for its continued use or proper disposal in the case of any alteration in the circumstances of the Group or of any change in the Scouters. In the case of a controlled Group, reference should be made in this connection to Rule 205, which has been considerably expanded and made clearer than in the 1938 P.O.R.

Where the Group possesses property of any appreciable value, trustees should be appointed, and the property should be made the subject of a properly constituted trust. There are two methods of doing this:-

- 1. Where the property is of some considerable value (land, stocks, shares, etc.) it may be desirable to appoint the Boy Scouts Association Trust Corporation as trustee. Full particulars of this method can be obtained on application to the Secretary.
- 2. In other cases local trustees should be appointed, and a model form of Trust Deed can be obtained from I.H.Q. with particulars of the method of completing it.

TRUSTEES.

In regard to local trustees, the following points may be mentioned:-

- (a) NUMBERS. It will generally be found most satisfactory to appoint three or four trustees. Too large a number may make it difficult to get business dealt with expeditiously, but on the other hand, too small a number may soon make it necessary to appoint a new trustee in the event of one of the original trustees desiring to be relieved or being no longer able to act.
- (b) PERSONAL STANDING. Provided the persons suggested as trustees are persons of good repute, their social position or their financial circumstances, so long as the latter are not precarious, are not matters of particular consequence.
- (c) PERMANENCE. They should obviously be persons who are likely to remain in the district and be available for some years. Accordingly, men whose employment might necessitate their removal at any moment would not be suitable, nor would a person of advanced age or one who was engaged in a risky occupation, financially or otherwise.
- (d) INTEREST. They should be closely in touch with the unit and its affairs, and should be able to keep the unit warned of its liabilities and to encourage and possibly assist it in the raising of the necessary funds. For this reason it seems generally desirable that the Trustees in the case of a Group should be members of the Group Committee.

The above conditions should not be too difficult to fulfil anywhere, and if it is suggested in any particular case that a unit may find it difficult to secure local trustees, this in itself may be an indication that the unit is possibly about to undertake an unjustifiable liability.
