#### GRANTS - 1st TOTLEY GROUP

I refer to your letter dated 3rd June 1950 addressed to Mr A.P. Coote, our County Commissioner, advising us of approval of a grant of £70 towards the building of our new Headquarters.

I am pleased to say that the scheme is now substantially complete. The official opening ceremony took place on Saturday 5th May 1951. It was attended by our District Commissioner, Local Association President, Assistant District Commissioners, the District Commissioner for Sheffield, and the Estates Surveyor for Sheffield. As a matter of interest I enclose two photographs taken by the Sheffield Telegraph on that occasion.

With the aid of the undermentioned loans and grant, we have now paid all outstanding accounts on the building.

- 1. A loan of £70 from IHQ. (Half of this loan has already been repaid.)
- 2. A private loan of £70. Still to be repaid.
  3. A further private loan of £27. Already repaid.
- 4. A grant of £30 from the Sheffield Education Committee towards furnishing the Headquabters.

Attached is a statement of the full cost of the project.

You already have a copy of the plan of the Headquarters, and the work has been completed generally in accordance with the plan (minor improvements have, of course, been incorporated as the work has proceeded).

Buring the seventeen months from December 1949 to May 1951 work proceeded continuously on the scheme, and complete records have been kept of hours of voluntary work put in by friends, Scouters and Scouts. The grand total of working hours is 3,800. No part of the project has been done without voluntary help: demolition, re-erection, concrete floors, brick partitioning walls, drains, paths, gas (under the supervision of a qualified man), electric wiring (again under the voluntary supervision of a fully qualified electrician), wall boarding, plastering, decoration, etc.

Since the shell of the building was erected, it has been in partial use (often under great difficulty) because we had no other place available for our Scout meetings. The provision of such a Headquarters was without doubt a necessity in this place, and if we may with modesty say this, all who have seen it are well satisfied, and assure us that it is a place of which we may well be proud. The states Surveyor for Sheffield at the opening ceremony expressed himself well satisfied with the scope and quality of the work.

As regards its effect on the retention of Senior Secuts, we may say that some months ago we were able to form a second Senior Patrol, and that we have now arrived at the position where a third Patrol is desirable. In addition, four ex-Senior Scouts (ages 18 to 22) have returned to assist the Group as Secutors.

Whilst the following is not really relevent from a strictly Scouting point of view we think it is of interest. During the last few months we have been able to assist a young and struggling Too H branch to get going by allowing them the use of one of the rooms in our Headquarters each fortnight. There are other organisations who would like to make use of a room, but as the Hoadquarters is in use almost every evening in the week for Scouting purposes we have had to hold our hand.

It will be seen from the third paragraph of this letter that we have outstanding in loans £105. The Group Committee and Scouts are proceeding enthusiastically with money reasing efforts to provide funds for the maintenance and running expenses of the Headquarters; Scouting expenses; further work such as gardens and shrubs (which are required by the terms of the lease); and eventually it is hoped to accumulate sufficient money to provide a cleaner and more satisfactory floor surface than concerts. It is hoped, therefore, that the promised

ment will now be available to assist us in re-paying loans, and ensuring that Scouting activities and the Headquatters will be properly financed and maintained by the future activities of our Group Committee and the Scouts themselves.

If there is any further information which you require I shall be pleased to supply it.

This letter is being sent via our District Commissioner and County Commissioner.

Dear Mr Bale,

As promised I have gone through the very considerable accumulation of correspondence in connection with our meadquarters, and picked out one or two things which I think will give you an idea of the first steps, and also the conditions attached to a grant.

You will realize, of course, that IHQ are not waiting to hand out grants just for the asking - it sounded all too easy in the CC's letter in Kinder Scout. However, the thing is to start off in the right way.

You will see from the information I received in 1949 (I had to make rough copies because Mr Swanwick wanted the letter and memorandum) that an application for a grant will not be considered if commitments of any kind (purchases, contracts, etc) have been entered to before application is made. I gather that you have not done anything of that nature yet. Then you will see from the general notes which accompanied the grant application form that it is not possible for IHQ to consider an application until after application has been made to the Local Education Authority and the result is known.

From the papers you will gather, also, that the Group is expected to help itself as much as

possible in the way of voluntary labour on the project, and by raising a good part of the money required (at least one-third to a half of the total estimated cost) before applying for a grant from any source.

I think your plan of campaign should be roughly as following:

- 1. I should write to IHQ asking about the possibility of a grant for building a Headquarters. You will then have the information by you, and IHQ will know that you have some project in mind.
- 2. Plans for Town and County Planning will then be necessary, and you will have to get estimates for the work you cannot do yourselves. Your own Group financial position will, of course, need to be investigated.
- 3. As soon as the Local Authority have given planning approval, an approach can be made to the Local Education Authority to see what assistance they will give you. You will notice that IHQ suggest that application forms to the LEA should be filled in pencil, and sent to them for comment.
- 4. When the LEA have said what they will do, then you can apply to InQ.

If it is ndcessary or advisable that actual work should be started, or contacts entered into, before actual application is made for grants, I suggest that you tell IHQ that you anticipate applying for a grant, but that such and such work is necessary, and ask for permission to proceed.

All applications for grants and reports require the approval and support of the DC (and CC), so, of course, you will send all such things to THQ via them.

I have set down rather bluntly what is required, but hope it will help. If there is anything that is not clear, or any further information which I can give, please don't hesitate to ask.

I shall be pleased to have the papers back when you have read them through.
