

Dear Editor,

While I intend to support to the full the visit of our Chief Scout to Buxton next Whitsuntide, I feel that the place is not

very suitable.

Buxton, the highest market town in England, is situated in ideal country in the heart of the Peak, but it is not geographically central and its communications are not good. Matlock is more geographically central but, like Buxton, it is on the branch railway

line from Ambergate to Chinley.

Despite the disadvantages of Drum Hill as regards wood and water, I feel that its easy accessibility from Derby makes it an ideal centre. Just as in the old Roman Empire it was said that "All roads lead to Rome" so now it might be said in Derbyshire "All

rails lead to Derby".

The main railway running south from Sheffield to Derby would admirably serve the Chesterfield and Clay Cross Districts. The branch line from Chinley to Ambergate would serve the Hope Valley. High Peak, Glossop, Buxton, Bakewell and Matlock Districts. Ashbourne, Ilkeston, Long Eaton and Swadlincote are all in direct rail communication with Derby and Duffield, Ripley and Derby districts are all on the doorstep of Drum Hill.


