ANNUAL REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

We can again report another successful year with a further increase in membership, which now totals 197. All sections have functioned in a satisfactory manner and the only matter for regret which we have to report, is that during the course of the year "The Good Companions" decided to cease association with us, it being their wish to be associated only with the Sheffield Council of Social Service. The Chairman of the Association spoke to a meeting of the Good Companions, but it appears to be the feeling of their members that they wished to be independent, and that the facilities offered to them by the association, in the way of use of the Billard Room and participation in our evening activities, was not of interest to them. The Council, despite their disappointment, has agreed to their renting our premises, and has been no less generous to them than in the past, and we wish them every success for the future.

During the course of the year, we have had visits from Mayfield, St. Mary's and Manor Community Associations all of which were thoroughly enjoyed, but the visit from Manor emphasized our need for a much larger room. We have also paid return visits to Mayfield and St. Mary's Community Associations. The Council are firm believers in the value of these visits to and from other Associations.

The Christmas Fair was again a success from every point of view, but it has been suggested that too many people are organising Fairs and that we might introduce some other money-raising effort. Amongst the suggestions made, which include Coffee Mornings, Jumble Sales, Bring & Buy, Spring Fair - is one that each member should be given 10/- and by individual effort, double this amount in 6 months, and then arrange a Social Evening, at which the results could be handed over.

Our Christmas Party and Dinner was the most successful we have ever organised. An important reason for this was the fact that none of our members were involved in "Kitchen Duties". This is perhaps the appropriate time to mention Kitchen Duties. The Association is a voluntary organisation, and membership of the Catering Committee should not mean a "sentence of 12 months kitchen work". If all members would take a turn, duties would not come round very often. The Council suggest that a Catering Committee should be formed representing all sections, whose duty it will be to arrange a rota. The present system involves the same people doing the work all the time.

We have now got permission to install a Notice Board outside the Hall, and we are waiting approval of our detailed plan.

The Brains Trust arranged in conjunction with the Municipal Officers Guild was a great success, and it is hoped to arrange more of these.

Sick visiting has been arranged where possible, but the Council are of the opinion that each section should have its own visitor, so that there is less chance of members being missed.

The Council have to record, with regret, the deaths of the following members :- Mrs. Hopkinson, Mr. Marshall, Mrs. Crowther and Mrs. Marshall.

We have contributed to various Charities during the course of the year and hope to continue with this work. We should like to place on record our thanks to Mr. Hammond for looking after the room bookings on our behalf.

Section Reports

Old Time Dancing - every Thursday evening a good number of community members make an extremely pleasant evening dancing the old time sequence dances, alternate Thursdays we have an instructor with a partner to demonstrate new dances and revive old forgotten ones.

The progressive dances assure a newcomer of meeting everyone, the general atmosphere of friendliness makes this section a very progressive well patronized part of community activities.

- 2. Caledonian Dancing This section has made good use of the premises during the Summer months, but the class is so successful during the Winter, that our premises are not large enough and Greystones Ballroom is hired for the weekly class.
- 3. Billiards Section This section has now increased its membership and members are taking full advantage of the facilities we have to offer.
- 4. Whist Section This section is still one of the most popular and each Saturday there is an average attendance of from 40 to 50. On the first Saturday in each month (providing members are equal) a partner drive is held.
- 5. Table Tennis Section Although we are a new section we have had a very good first year. We were very fortunate in having a new table to start the season in September and shall finish either third or fourth in the Men's 5th Division of the Sheffield & District Table Tennis League. We ourselves are very satisfied with this result for our team consists of three ladies and one man. One of our members, Mrs. Bennett has also reached the Ladies Final in the Sheffield Closed Tournament which has still to be played.

We started last April with five members and now have eighteen or twenty. During the summer months we hope to expand still further so that we may enter two teams in the league next year.

We do wish to thank all members very sincerely for the friendliness and kindness shown to us in this our first year and hope we shall be able to repay in the coming years.

- 6. Orchestra this has been a very good attendance at rehearsals and membership shows an increase. A section of the Orchestra played for our Christmas Fair. The concert that we gave at St. John's was quite a success and our members are always available to assist in any special events at the centre.
- 7. Cycling Section Sheffield Sports Cycling Club the past year has been very successful, with a good turnout on the weekly runs and regular attendances for the Thursday Club night at Abbeydale Hall. The Annual Dinner arranged this year by our younger members, was a great success and proved that we have some capable youngsters to carry on our work.
- 8. Dore & Totley Ladies Guild a very successful year total membership of 75 average attendance at meetings 41 members. Excellent series of speakers, films and demonstrations, and several very pleasant Outings to places of interest and already in 1960 we have visited a well known Bakery and Textile Mill and we have further items of this nature later this year. Our Monthly Competitions have been well supported. In 1959 we were able to give £25 to 3 charities and hope to repeat this again this year. We are constantly getting new members as old ones are lost to us for various reasons.

Our membership fee is still only 3/6d. and we shall be pleased to welcome any new members.

We meet on the 2nd Thursday of each month at 2.15 p.m.

In conclusion, The Council would like to thank all members for their support in the past year.

We would like each member to make every effort to attend the Annual Meeting on Wednesday, 18th May, at 7.45 p.m. and all suggestions to improve the Association will be welcomed.

Annual Report of the Council for 1961/62

Once more we can report a year of continual progress: we have maintained our membership and, in fact, increased it, and as far as can be seen from the Treasurer's report, our financial position is quite healthy.

It must be admitted that we have not done all the things we set out to do, but some progress has been made.

We were promised some improvements in the premises during the year, but unfortunately these have not materialised, due largely to the credit restrictions of the last twelve months. We are still hopeful that the repairs to the kitchen, corridors and the floor in the Dance Room will not be long delayed.

We have continued to prosper in all sections, as can be seen further on in this report, and one thing which pleases the Council most is that we have now got junior members in both the Table Tennis and Cycling Sections. We have also had an application from some youngsters for a room for a body-building class, which the Council are now considering.

We have managed to undertake more visits during this past year, having visited Stradbroke, St. Marys's and Mayfield Community Associations, and received visits from Mayfield and St. Mary's. We consider that these visits are an important part of our activities.

Enclosed with this report is a proposed constitution, which will be put forward for your acceptance at the Annual General Meeting. Seven years ago we had neither constitution nor cash, but now that we have a large reserve, it is necessary that we should adopt a constitution and it will be even more important if the plans we have for expansion materialise.

During the year we have brought our office methods more up to date: we have a loose-leaf system for the members whereby we can keep a check on members who do not rejoin us. We have also purchased a steel cabinet so that all our records can be kept at the centre.

The 2/6 scheme, whilst not quite as successful as last year, has, however, achieved a fair proportion of our target, and we should like to thank all those members who have made a special effort. The Jumble Sale in connection with this was very successful, but with more helpers on the day, we could have made fifty pounds easily, so we would appeal for more members to help us when the next one is arranged.

The gift from the Good Companions was much appreciated.

Amongst the social activities of the year, the Pea & Pie Supper was

very well supported, and the Annual Dinner was again a great success. We had to change the caterers, but the Council are of the opinion that we should reserve Bouchers for the next year's Dinner.

It is with regret that we have to record the deaths of two of our Members, Mrs. Kilner and Mr. Carson, and we wish to extend our condolences to their relatives.

Section Reports.

Whist Section

This section has continued to get excellent support during the year, the average number of tables has increased to 12/14 tables per week, and partner-drives have been held monthly. One has only to attend, to realise that at Totley, Whist does not mean silence.

Table Tennis Section

This year as far as our team in the Sheffield & District Table Tennis League is concerned, we've had our best year. We shall finish fourth out of twelve in our Division. Recently, in order to give non-team players a game on match night we tried using an upstairs room. However, the carrying of the heavy table upstairs and then down after the matches, has taken away any enjoyment. We have had one or two new young members and we hope these will attract further young members.

Cycling Section

The Sheffield Sports Cycling Club. The Club completed a successful year in 1961 having promoted and participated in cycle races of all kinds with great success.

An eventful Social Season was enjoyed by all and the new year of 1962 was heralded by an increase in membership and the presentation of 1961 awards at the Annual Dinner in February.

The 1962 Racing Season is now well under way and riders are competing in many parts of the country every weekend and meeting with great success. Good support has been given to the facilities at the Club Room at Abbeydale Hall.

Dore & Totley Guild

The Guild has maintained its Membership during the year, during which we had a variety of speakers at our Meetings. We have had a number of visits to Factories and Country Houses of interest.

Old Time Dance Section.

We had another successful year and maintained a very good average attendance. We could increase this, if only we had a better floor. We have a very wide selection of records now and each month we replace some of the old ones. During the year we lost the services of Mr. Wells, who took up a more remunerative post, but Ken and Sheila have taken over as Instructors, and are making an

excellent job of it.

We held a very successful Old Time Dance at Meersbrook Vestry Hall in October.

Billiards Section

This section is now being fully utilised and our thanks are due to Mr. Hammand for keeping the table in such good condition. Use is also being made of the Dart Board which has been installed.

Orchestra

This section has had a good attendance of members. They gave a concert at Middlewood Hospital last month. There was a good attendance at the Annual Dinner. Although they are now under the Education Committee, many are still members of the Association and would like to remain a part of it.

In our report last year mention was made of the need for younger members, and this year we have shown a slight improvement, but more remains to be done.

The Council would like to thank all members for their continued support during the past year.

Annual Report, 1967/1968

This year the Association celebrates its 21st Birthday, and we can be proud of the progress that we have made, we have had our share of set backs, at one time we hadn't a penny in the 'kitty', and a membership of less thatn twenty, now we have a reasonable balance in the bank, and a membership of over 250.

We are still not satisfied, and have a number of targets to achieve, the main one is still the need for at least one really large room, as this is still restricting our growth, and the activities of some of our sections.

A welcome improvement to the premises as been the tiling of the floors in two rooms, the passageways and toilets.

We have had two very successful jumble sales during the year, and these help to keep our subscriptions at a very low rate.

Visits to and from other Community Associations have again been disappointing, but this has been entirely due to the lack of response from the Association we have invited.

ANNUAL REPORT 1969/1970

We have completed another successful year, we have shown an increase in membership, we are in a sound financial position, and our only major problem is the lack of an extension to Abbeydake Hall. This would help to widen our activities.

The death of our Treasurer, Cliff Holland, has been a major blow to the Association, and the Council would like to place on record its appreciation of the work which he did. Annual Report 1970/1971

The year has seen a further increase in membership, and although our progress has not been common to all our sections, we are now a firmly established Association.
