SECRETARY'S REPORT ON THE WORK OF THE PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL FOR 1935.

The work of the Church Council has proceeded on much the same lines as in previous years. The usual number of meetings has been held and all matters relating to the Church have been discussed openly, thoroughly and with a total absence of personalities or ill feeling. Probably the most important item of interest enacted during the year has been the substitution of Free Leaflets for the Parish Magazine. For some years past it has been felt that the magazine instead of augmenting the income of the church were annually become an expense and as the charges for printing &c. seemed to be somewhat erratic, against which we had no remedy it was thought that the distribution of free leaflets would not only provide a large portion of the cost by means of advertisements but would have the advantage of putting the work and services of the church into every house in the parish. It is too early to speak of the success of the scheme but the Church Council trusts it will do what it is mainly intended to do; that is increase our congregations both morning and evening. Early in the year a number of new prayer books were presented to the church- a very welcome gift- and for the providing of a similar number of a similar type the council voted a sum of money.

The annual Subscription to the Hospitals was made up to £8 at the meeting in April. This year a "Village" Market was not held, but a "Second Hand" sale resulted in a profit of over £7 which the Council voted for the Bishop of Derby's Appeal Fund.

The number on the Parochial Roll is now 129.

VICAR'S LETTER.

My Dear Friends.

I make no apology for writing to you this month about Church finance. Many people seem to take it for granted that their Parish Church will go on as usual week after week, that whenever they choose to visit it they will always find the door open the building clean and tidy and comfortably heated. They expect that books will be provided and the organ playing.

If they come only rarely, perhaps to be married or to bring a baby to be babtized they still assume that the Church will always be there when they want it; but many of them never ask themselves who pays for it to be kept ready for them or how much it costs to keep a church open.

Well first I want you to know that your Church depends entirely upon the voluntary contributions of those who attend it. There is no other sauce of income whatsoever.

It actually costs about f3 a week to pay the ordinary expenses and every penny of this comes from Church collections. If we have a poor attendance, we have a poor collection, and yet the expenses remain the same.

In order to meet this problem a number of our people have joined a Free Will Offering Scheme and undertaken to give a contribution every week whether they are present or not. The membership of this scheme numbers 114 and their contributions range from a penny a week upwards, I want to ask those who have not joined the scheme to do so now.

If your Church is worth maintaining will you help to maintain it? Is it worth a penny, or threepence or a shilling a week to you to have a Church of your own? If it is please send me your name and I will provide you with a packet of envelopes (one for each each week) so that you may be one of those who help regularly to meet these weekly expenses.

It is the best and fairest way of doing it. Don't let a few people bear all the burden as they are doing at present, but please shoulder your own little bit of it and help to remove the constant anxiety from which we are never wholly free.


