





VICAR'S LETTER.

My Dear Friends,

I have given considerable thought to the question of special services in Church in connection with the Coronation, & have decided not to hold any service at the actual time of the ceremony because we shall all wish to hear the broadcast not only of the service itself but of the interesting commentary on the procession to and from the Abbey which I expect will be provided. It is obvious that if we did as has been suggested and listened to the ceremony in Church we should have to confine ourselves to the Abbey service only and should have to miss the other interesting parts of the programme. I propose therefore to have one service only on Coronation Day -namely Holy Communion at 8 a.m. at which service special prayers will be offered for our King and Queen and I hope that as many of you as possible will come. There is no fitter way of offering intercession than the Lord's own service and no better act of self-dedication to the service of God. On the previous Sunday at 11 a.m. the special form of service authorized by the Archbishops will be used in place of our usual morning prayer and in the evening special prayers will be added and appropriate Psalms & Lessons will be read.

The services on Ascension Day will be as in previous years. Please note that the Childrens service is primarily for the Day School and that any other people who wish to attend it are asked to sit behind the choir

The Whitsuntide Hymns will be sung in Church on Whit Monday at 3 p.m. and other arrangements will follow the usual lines.



VICAR'S LETTER.

My Dear Friends,

Now that summer days are with us and the prospect (according to the weather prophets) of a dry and hot season, I think a few timely words from me may not be out of place on the subject of the Christian duty of Sunday worship. For unless we do regard worship as a DULY, and a very important one, the likelihood that it will ever become a fixed and regular habit is exceedingly remote. And it must be admitted that in hot and sunny summer weather nothing but a keen sense of duty will overcome the extra ordinary pull of the comfortable deck chair in the garden or the temptation to join the brotherhood of the road. Please do not think that I would advocate the Puritan Sabbath and deny the rightful place of reasonable recreation and enjoyment; but to a Christian there can be no question but that his FIRST duty on the Lord's Day is worship, and a Sunday without worship is a Sunday spoilt.

Sunday is the day on which we have a fixed engagement with which nothing but real necessity should ever be allowed to interfere. On Sunday Christian people know that they have a special invitation to the house of the King of Kings—an appointment to meet the Master. It is an appointment which He will certainly keep, for His love for His dear children never changes, and if our love for Him is real then we shall keep it too. That is the Sunday question in a nutshell.

But in order to fulfil our duty we shall have to use a little method and a lot of common sense. We shall have to arrange our plans carefully; we shall even have to tell our friends kindly but plainly that we have a fixed engagement at Church-time and that they must so arrange their visits that we may be able to keep it. After all, if our friends dropped in just as we were going out to a business appointment they would know what to expect. Is our Father's business really less urgent?. The real trouble with most Christians is not that they are unchristian but that they are unbusinesslike in their religion. We need more method and more arrangement, and we shall not get it until we see that the things of God are of first importance and give them first place in our plan of living.

VICAR'S LETTER.

My Dear Friends,

This leaflet will find its way into a little more than 800 houses and therefore it provides me with an opportunity of speaking to a very large audience but I want you if you will, to imagine that this letter is addressed to you personally. Of course if the contents of it do not apply to you, then please forgive me and take it that it was meant for someone else. First of all I want to talk to you quite simply about your religion. Not just about religion in general but about your own.

Are you quite sure you have got a religion and if so what is it?. What difference does it make to your way of life?. Probably you have been baptized. If so, you were then made a Christian- a member of the Christian Church. Would it have mattered much or made any difference if you had NEVER been baptized. After all there is not much point in becoming a life member of a society and then forgetting all about it. Or perhaps you once were a practising Christian perhaps you attended Sunday School as a child and received the gift of Confirmation and went to church on Sundays. If so, have you since given up your religion? Or are you one of those who call themselves Christians and Churchmen but think it doesn't matter whether they exercise their membership or not?

If you want to get married would you go to the registrar or would you claim the privilege of the Church's blessing? If you have no use for the Church's blessing on the other days of your life it is a bit of a farce to bother about it on your wedding day. Or would you bring your child to be baptized?. What use is that unless you mean to bring him up in the full practice of the Church's faith?. Unless you are a real humbug you must admit that it would be better to leave these things undone if they are to be allowed to mean nothing at all. You cannot have it both ways Christ alway asks for all or nothing. And please don't tell me the old tale about how you can worship God so much better in the open air than you can in church. You know as well as I do that in practice it just doesn't work. Don't tell me that all these people who stay away from Church are thinking about God and worshipping Him. You know it is not true and never will be true. They are thinking of themselves and their own enjoyment and of nothing else whatever,

It needs real effort to think of God-it needs real effort to pray and worship and it is a fact that unless we make this effort and go on making it we lose touch with God and forget His claims on us and indeed His very Existence. Admit frankly and honestly, if it is true, that you have given up religion and lost your sense of the things eternal and if you would regain it you must start afresh on the old well trodden ways.

A parochial gathering is being arranged for Tuesday Evening on similar lines to that held last year.

May I draw your attention to the paragraph below about our finance and ask for further support in this matter.

PLEASE HELP!

- Q. 1—Do you know what it costs to maintain your Parish Church week by week?.
- Q. 2-Do you know how the necessary money is found?.
- Q. 3—Are you one of those who contribute regularly to provide it?
- A 1-In order to keep Totley Church open-to pay for cleaning. heating, lighting, books, music and other current expenses we need about f3 weekly. That means that somebody has to find about 6d. a week for every seat in the church. This expense must be met whether the seats are occupied or not.
- A. 2 -Nearly five-sixths of our total weekly income is provided by those who belong to our weekly envelope scheme. The remaining sixth comes from those who do not but who give through the collection WHEN THEY ARE PRESENT. On wet Sundays and during holiday months congregations are ant to be very thin indeed but the empty seats still have to be paid for by somebody. The members of our F.W.O. scheme (about 100 in number) each possess a book of envelopes-one for every Sunday of the year and are thus contributing their,

share every week whether they attend or stay away. But members sometimes leave the district or die and it is necessary to find new members to replace them.

A. 3—Only you can answer this. If the answer is no, it can easily be made yes, if you will apply to the Vicar for your booklet of envelopes. Please think it over quickly and join the scheme.

IMPORTANT I

We are asked by Councillor Gledhill to publish the following

With reference to the Parish of Totley's Representation on the Governing Board of the Dronfield Grammar School, about which so many Ratepayers have enquired. I beg to say that under the Board of Education's scheme 8th. October 1909, the Derbyshire County Council were entitled to two Governors, the Dore Parish Council and the Totley Parish Council one Governor each, other authorities also appointed Governors.

This scheme was amended by the Sheffield Extension Act 1933. By that act the Derbyshire Council were entitled to elect four Governors on the Dronfield Grammar School Board instead of two, and the authority of the Dore Parish Council and the Totley Parish Council to elect Governors ceased. The persons who immediately before the 1st April, 1934 were representatives of the Dore and Totley Parish Councils were allowed to continue in office until the end of the period for which they were appointed. By the sad death of Mr. J. R. Rodgers who served the Parish so well for many years as their representative, Totley is not now entitled to elect a Governor.
