VICAR'S LETTER.

My Dear Friends,

On Sunday Feb. 27th the first of the Confirmation Classes will be held in Church after the Evening Service. These classes will last about half an hour and will be spread over a period of twelve or thirteen weeks. It is important that candidates should attend every class. It is also important that all candidates should begin together and I shall not accept any who wish to join after Feb. 27th. As in previous years we welcome at these classes any members of our congregation who may care to attend them and renew the memory of their own Confirmation, and of the instruction which they received then.

At the time of writing the annual statement of our financial position has not been published but it should appear on the church notice board early in February. I believe it will show a small credit balance but this has only been possible by rigid economy coupled with the fortunate circumstance that no exceptional expenditure has been necessary during the year. It cannot be said that our position is entirely satisfactory and it never can become so until more substantial support is given by those who come infrequently to church and who do not belong to the Envelope scheme. I appeal especially to those who come occasionally to consider whether their contributions to the maintenance of their church & its work are really a fair proportion of the burden.—The real question is this: If you value the privilege of having a parish Church to go to (even a few times a year only) you must realize that that church needs a considerable weekly income in order to remain open at all and I suggest that there are some at least in the parish who might very well consider making an annual donation of a sum equivalent to a regular weekly subscription. If you are not prepared to join our weekly offering Scheme will you become an annual subscriber? If your church is worth maintaining at all is it worth a penny a week? If so it is worth 4/4 a year & yet there are occasional worshippers whose annual contributions amount to less than that.

You must forgive me for rubbing it in but these things have to be said and the fellow who has to say them is

VICAR'S LETTER.

My Dear Friends,

Once more the season of Lent offers to us all its opportunity of testing the sincerity of our Christian profession. There is of course no one hard and fast rule for everybody and it is impossible for me to attempt to tell each of you how you yourself should observe Lent but I can offer a few simple suggestions to help you make rules for yourself.

(1) Lent is a time for quiet and serious reflection upon spiritual things. I suggest that to read carefully through one of the 4 gospels would be a great help to most people. Also I will gladly lend books to those who wish to borrow them.

(2) It is a time for learning how to pray better. It is often forgotten that prayer is a difficult art and needs real practice and perseverance. If we have little time for prayer we must at all costs MAKE time by a more sensible arrangement of our daily routine.

(3) It is a time for discipline and self-denial. We have to learn somehow that our own inclinations are of small importance and must be subordinated to the will of God. Nobody ever yet became a real Christian by doing only and always just as he liked. God must come first. That is the keynote of all real religion and a well spent Lent will help us to put God and His perfect will before everything else.

VICAR'S LETTER.

My Dear Friends,

Please read carefully the announcement of services for Holy Week and Easter in the preceding paragraph. No doubt most of you are already making your plans for the Easter Holiday. Please don't forget the most important part of it—namely the observance of the Easter Festival, and especially your Easter Communion. Those who through illness cannot make their Communion in church are asked to let me know in order that arrangements can be made for a service in their own homes during Easter Week. If you intend to be away from home on Easter Day, find out beforehand the times of service at the nearest Parish Church.

Many readers will welcome the decision of the Church Council to take steps to improve the heating system of the church. We hope that before next winter four additional radiators will have been placed in the body of the church and the furnace and boiler enlarged. The cost will be £60. A fund for this purpose has been opened and already more than half the money has been promised or subscribed.

VICAR'S LETTER.

(TO PARENTS)

My Dear Friends,

God has entrusted to your care one or more of His children. Most of you have brought your child to be baptized and "made a member of Christ, the child of God and an inheritor of the Kingdom of Heaven." Together with godfathers and godmothers you solemnly undertook to see that your child should learn as soon as he was able those things which a Christian ought to know and believe. What steps are you taking to fulfil that promise? Who is teaching your child those things? Who is teaching him to pray, to worship and to read and love the Bible? Who is teaching him the meaning of his membership in the Church and helping him to be a faithful soldier and servant of Christ?

Well, primarily this responsibility is your own and nothing can absolve you from it. Nothing can take the place of a Christian home. If prayer worship and Sunday mean nothing to you they will mean nothing to your child and our Lord has said, "Whosoever shall offend one of these little ones that believe in me it is better for him that a millstone were hanged about his neck and he were cast into the sea." It is a dreadful responsibility to accept the charge of one of Gods dear children and then to allow him to grow up, through your neglect or carelessness or example without a religion at all. And it is not too much to say that this is actually happening in thousands of English homes. The first essential, then is to lay the foundations in the home, but even if you are doing this there is much which you cannot do by yourself.

In many parishes including our own there is the priceless benefit of a Church Day School in which all the teachers are convinced Christians and the faith of the Church is fully taught. This cannot be over-valued but there is still something which the day school cannot do. It cannot create the atmosphere of a Christian Sunday and it is becoming painfully clear that when Sunday ceases to be in a true sense "the Lord's Day" it is but a short step to the complete neglect of religion and of God's claims upon us. The purpose of Sunday School is chiefly to bring to bring the Sunday atmosphere of worship and spiritual refreshment into the child's life

and help him to know that he is truly the child of God. Will you for the sake of those children you love, first ensure that their homes are truly Christian homes and your example such as you would desire them to follow, and secondly accept what help the Sunday School can give in training them to love and serve the King of Kings.

Lastly—it is a mistake to imagine that quite young children are not old enough to be taken to church with their parents. Of course they cannot follow the whole service or understand the sermon but if we believe that the church is God's House and that God is there to meet us and to bless us and if we remember how Jesus rebuked his disciples for turning the children away, surely we can believe that our Father can bless them too. Our Lord said "Suffer the little children to come unto me and forbid them not for of such is the Kingdom of Heaven." Do not stay away from church because of the children—come and bring them with you and have faith that God will find His own way of reaching their hearts. They will learn more by seeing their parents pray and worship than all the teachers or parsons in the world can ever teach them.

VICAR'S LETTER.

My Dear Friends,

On Whitsunday seven members of our congregation were confirmed by the Bishop of Derby at St. John's Church. This is an event of very great importance, not only to them but to the parish to which they belong, because the real strength of a parish is the body of devout and regular communicants who are living the full life of membership in the Christian family. It cannot be said too often or too strongly that the Sacrament of Holy Communion is the very heart of the Christian religion. Our Lord has said "Except ye eat the Flesh of the Son of Man and drink His Blood ye have no life in you." The trouble with so many Christians is that their religion is lifeless and feeble and the cause in very many instances is that their souls are undernourished.
