My dear Friends,

A great many people have been disturbed by the recent outburst of anti-semitism which has broken out in Germany and even here in Britain. I do not think we need take the wretched daubing of swastikas on the walls of our own cities and towns too seriously—it is probably the work of irresponsible elements in our population who are prepared to jump on any cockeyed bandwagon so long as it spells trouble for someone.

The outbreak in Germany is somewhat different. I'm quite sure that the German police have noted how precisely this outbreak of anti-Jewish feeling has corresponded to the lessening of tension over Berlin and the renewed hope for the re-unification of Germany. Are we meant to say — "ah yes, once a German always a German—the country is far better divided in two". That may well be so, but one wonders who is really behind the recent outbursts — is there someone really behind these wretched Nazis stirring up trouble behind the scenes — could it be that behind the swastikas daubed on the synagogue walls there is the faint shadow of another national emblem equally hated and feared by the West?

Racial discrimination wherever it may appear is an evil thing and there is a great deal of it in the world of our day. What have we, as Christians, to say at such an hour as this? I am reminded of a visit which Pastor Niemoller paid us shortly after the end of the war. He told us that he had never any doubt as to the witness he must bear in the days of Hitler. He must proclaim the Lordship of Christ. We know at what a cost he upheld the Crown Rights of the Redeemer. There followed cruel persecution and the concentration camp. The day came at last when he was set at liberty. Once more he was a free man, free to utter the word of God. But he found that he was tongue-tied; he had nothing to say. What was the word of God for such an hour? He visited the German churches. He found the people bewildered and frustrated. "We must trust in God", said their pastors. "A great calamity has come upon us; we must put our trust in God". It seemed a proper thing to say, but was it more than a pious platitude? He was asked to speak at a great conference of the churches. What could he say? Suddenly, the message flashed upon him: "Repent and believe". The only way to recover faith is by way of repentance. Once more he had the word of God for his people.

The Greatest Tragedy of Our Generation

I HAVE COME ACROSS VERY few really bad people in my life. The trouble with most of us is that we are ineffectively good and for the most part so absorbed in our own small (though to us big) concerns that we fail to notice the needs of others.

The root of the trouble is lack of imagination. Only when some tragedy is brought to our very door do we sit up and take notice. Only when our country is threatened from across the Channel do we throw ourselves into action.

But for most of our life we just drift along, decent, amiable people, without too much concern for those less fortunate than ourselves.

In this year we are being faced with what is probably the greatest tragedy of our generation, perhaps the greatest problem of human suffering that the world has ever seen—the tragedy of thousands of homeless refugees.

These people, through no fault of

their own, have been uprooted from their homes, their country, their loved ones, forced to walk miles with only the possessions they can carry, to find shelter in camps which are often devoid of everything except the barest necessities, and there they may remain with no future, no prospects, nothing to look forward to.

There are today thousands of these people in hundreds of such camps in Germany, Palestine, the Far East and elsewhere. In Western Germany they are still pouring across the border from East Germany in a never-ending stream.

What can we do about it? We can send clothes, which they need desperately. We can take financial responsibility, and if we choose to do so—responsibility for one refugee. We can send

Dear All of You,

World Refugee Year began on June 1st, which means that we are now three quarters of the way through. How well are we doing? How much have you done in your town, village, city? What has been done in your school, office, wherever? How much have you done?

Some places, I know, were at it on June 1st (they were the people who made their plans early, before the year began, so that they were all ready to get going!) — it took others of us a bit longer to get organised, but all through these nine months things have been happening.

Committees have been formed, people have got together to pool their ideas and their energies, and before long they were saying "Couldn't we do this?" "What about so-and-so?" and everybody got more and more enthusiastic and excited, and had better and better ideas, and so it has gone on, with no stopping.

There have been all sorts of things done—concerts, plays, bazaars, "Christmas Fayres," coffee mornings (I went to one, which made £80 for the funds, and which I shall always remember because I caught my knee against the table as I sat down and threw most of my cup of coffee across a dazzling white table-cloth!), barbecues, bonfires on the beach on Guy Fawkes' Night, with Hot Dog Stalls, parties, dances, "Miles of Pennies" (or whatever coins you like), jumble sales, the lot!—as well as all the usual things like flag days and house-to-house collections and the giving of money and prayers in Church.

It's all meant a great deal of hard work, lots of us have got very tired (especially the people who have had to count the money from street collections), but we've

enjoyed it immensely, we've had a lot of fun, in all sorts of unexpected ways, and most of us have found that we've got to know all sorts of extremely nice people whom we might otherwise not have

met. We've been doing this for refugees, but we've gained something too. Which does happen, you know. You set out to do something for someone else, and in the end you find that doing it has helped you as much as it has helped the other person.

Well, that's the first nine months. And if you've been feeling that none of this applies to you, as you read this, because the part of the world where you live hasn't done anything yet, don't worry. There are still three months to go, and you can do an awful lot in three months.

If you're really stuck for ideas, and can't find anyone to help you, write to me and I'll see what I can do. But I'm quite sure that you'll find someone in your own Church who will be only too glad to help you get going. And those of you who live in places where things have been going on, and who have been helping—that's just fine.

But don't think you can stop. There is so much to be done, so many people who need help, that if everybody worked flat

out all the year we still wouldn't solve every problem. Which means we have got to work flat out from now on, and go on doing it after the official end of World Refugee Year.

Right now, our next concern is Christian Aid Week in May, and you can well start getting clear what you are going to do about that. The little girl in the picture isn't very old. But she looks older than she is. Being a refugee does that to you. You aren't all that old either, but you're old enough to help. As well as praying and giving, you can work. However much you find you have to give up, you're still going to have an awful lot more than they have, of all the good things in life. And—whatever you seem to lose, momentarily, you'll find that you have instead something far, far better. Working with God brings its own happiness.

Then followed the famous meeting at Stuttgart where Pastor Niemöller and the leaders of the Confessional Church made their famous declaration as Germans, but above all, as Christians—"We stand in a solidarity of guilt with the people of Germany for the calamities that have come upon the world". There are few scenes in history more dramatic than the contrast between those men standing there, with the marks of suffering on their faces, proclaiming before God and the world "We are guilty", and that other scene at Nuremberg when those other men stood, their hands dripping with blood, and said, "Not Guilty". If you want to know the difference Christ has made, you can see it there.

And we all, stand in a solidarity of guilt with the human race for the state of the world today. One of the greatest deficiencies of our time is the failure of the imagination and the intellect to bring home to itself the portentous character of human sin.

Today, very few of us like to be reminded about sin and we still hear the old cliché, "Human nature cannot be changed"—you know the argument—the world is what it is because men are by nature selfish and cruel; it's absurd to think that you will ever get rid of poverty and war and racial hatreds and the other ills of society; things are what they are because man is what he is and you cannot change human nature. The best answer to that is to say that in a profound sense it is true. The world is what it is today because human nature, man as God created him, cannot be changed. Life as we are living it today does violence to human nature. Man is born for freedom, and everywhere he is in chains, the slave of many tyrannies, not least the tyranny of his own selfishness. Man is born for brotherhood, to live in peace with his neighbour; he is trying to live a self-centred life, and it doesn't work. Man is born a child of God, to share His life and love; and he is trying to live without God, and it doesn't work. Man is born with eternity set in his heart, and he is trying to live for this world only, and it doesn't work. You can't change human nature. You can defy it and prevent it but man will always be as God created him. "Thou hast made us for Thyself, and our hearts are restless till they rest in Thee". There is a vast immortal want stirring in the world of today and forbidding it to rest. The way of peace we cannot find till we find it where our immortal longings place it—"in the fullest and friendly eternity of God".

My dear Friends,

The season of Lent is that season of the Christian year, when the thoughts of all lovers of Christ look forward to the Passion week, and its commemoration of the great sacrifice. As people realise once more that their hope is rooted in divine suffering, a certain instinct in them recoils from self-indulgence. For that is what Lent implies and involves, if it be taken seriously and in a mood befitting its solemnity and beauty. It is a challenge to honest inner inspection and the cultivation of those disciplines of the soul without which spiritual reality may become as unreal as a mirage. The ancient saying, "The beginning of wisdom is the desire for discipline", is as true in the art of life as it is in the life of art.

No doubt to the sleek modern man, with his worship of comfort, it may seem absurd that any mortal should forego anything for the sake of his soul—but the spirit of denial of self is eloquent of the fact that man does not live by bread alone. The idea of abstinence, as such, may have little value, but that it may be put to high ends no one will deny. Lent may at least remind us that Christ does call us to something far higher and nobler than physical ease.

This is true, whatever else be false—that following Christ is a great adventure, and it means that we must take up a cross and bear it. Much as we may admire modern life, with many of the ideals of this indulgent age, there can be no compromise if we are to be followers of the Master. What fills me with a deep disquiet about much of our Christianity today is that it is so harmless. It is so tame, so timid, so tepid—a kind of glorified lollipop. Even if we were to apply it—really apply it—to social questions as we often talk of doing, there would be little result unless it has more power in it than it has now. It behoves us to think of the reality and ministry of our religion as we look toward the Passion of Him, who being rich, became poor, and was a friend of the lowly and forlorn. Lent evokes such thoughts, and it is therefore that we should keep it and wisely use it, doubly so in an age when "Pops are Tops" and noise is terrifying, lest as the Wages of Hurry we lose our souls!

Alas! instead of being a period of inner discipline, Lent in many parishes has become a period of relief from parochial junketings and feasting and the modern malady of too many social organisations—it has become a time of gentle moral manicuring! Penitence? For a few devout souls, yes; but for the mass of folk it is little more than a form. No doubt we need to deal with the little grey sins that eat away our peace; but is there to be no prayer and fasting for the dark social sins which make human life a hell? No broken and contrite heart for the

THE SEASON

of Lent is one of the most deeply rooted of all the traditions of the whole Christian Church—East and West, Protestant and Catholic.

It has a two-fold significance in the history and experience of the Church. It was both a recollection of the temptation of our Lord and of the events leading up to the Cross, and also a special season for penance, penitence and spiritual discipline.

Penitence, of course, was always recognised as a permanent need and condition of the Christian disciple. But it was a special Christian obligation during Lent. And it was in this way, and for this reason, that fasting and abstinence and the practice of asceticism were developed.

Trivial Abstinenes

But in our age, Lent has either vanished from our consciousness or been reduced to pettiness or vulgarity. Lent is the time for doing without sweets or sugar or—more strenuously—tobacco. I by no means despise these trivial abstinences. To a person with a very sweet tooth, abstaining from sugar and chocolate and liquorice allsorts may mean quite a moral effort. I do not know.

It is because of this that Lent has declined in the general experience of Church membership today. As I have said, I don't despise it. Sneering at petty abstinences comes badly from people who indulge all their desires, and who are complete strangers to abstinence of any kind. Going without what you like and want very much once a year is a good thing. But



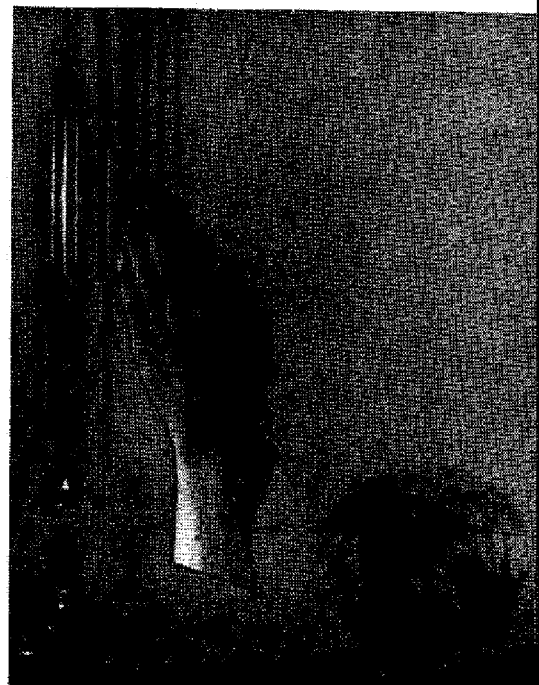

Lent means a lot more than merely going without things. It means even more than penitence.

The Meaning of Lent

Penitence and penance are intimately associated together. Penance was the outcome of penitence. The proof of penitence was willingness to undergo and endure penance. And in consequence (partly at least), penitence came more and more to be regarded as sorrow for sins committed; to be sorry for the wrong things that had been done. And to prove how sincerely sorry they were, people undertook to accept certain penalties by way of punishment, such as going without things, repeating a certain number of psalms or "Hail Mary's", or Paternosters, and suchlike.

This in turn tended to create the idea that the sins committed had been atoned for. It tended, in other words,



Dear All of You,

There is mention in this issue of Church News of the Feast of the Annunciation — and a picture of the new glass screen in St. Alban's Church in Norwich.

That has taken me back to 1951, when I was living just outside Norwich, and heard for the first time what has become one of my favourite carols — an old Basque Noel, which begins: "The angel Gabriel from Heaven came . . ." You probably know it.

When I first heard it, it was being used in a carol pageant for Christmas, a pageant which began, as do so many of our Christmas plays, with the Annunciation. In a way, of course, it's right that they should. After all, that's where the Christmas story begins.

There was a time-space between the Annunciation and the birth of our Lord, just as there is one between His birth and say, the visit of the Wise Men. For the sake of convenience we have all the events included in the same play, performed on the same night, and it doesn't matter because we all *know* that we are telescoping events and nobody really thinks that everything happened at once. Or do we?

Are you wondering why in the world I'm talking about Christmas in the middle of March? You've got the answer, higher up the page. The Christmas story begins here. The angel Gabriel was sent to tell Mary that she was to be the mother of God. God had chosen her. We *know* very little about her, but we can guess the sort of person she must have been, partly from what we read about her in the Bible, and partly because we know that God chose her to be the mother of Christ. He would have chosen someone who was "right" for the thing He wanted her to do.

He still chooses people. He is still wanting people to do things, and He wants the person who is "right" for each particular job. And He needs all of us. There is one thing which you, and only you, can

do for Him. He wants you to do it. You may not know yet what it is. He will not tell you until you are ready to listen.

When He sent His messenger to Mary, He knew that she was ready and willing to listen. He didn't ask her if she was willing to become the mother of this Child: it wasn't a question, it was an announcement. And Mary said, "Be it unto me according to thy word."

She wasn't arguing either. She was ready and willing to co-operate with God in whatever He wanted. Are we? Or are we still, deep-down, angling to get our own way, to do things our way rather than His? Do we think we know better than God? It may be that pride will keep us from admitting that this is true. Get rid of pride, and be humble and honest enough. And He will show you in time what He wants you to do.

When you know, you may not find yourself doing what you expect to do, immediately. Mary had to wait nine months before her baby was born. You may have to wait longer than that before you are doing the thing that God wants of you. It may take time to prepare for it. You may have to learn patience. And

while you're waiting, there are other things to do. Gerald Vann, in his book "The Son's Course," points out that Mary visited her cousin Elizabeth, who was also having a baby, and stayed with her three months "in order to help her with the housework till her baby was born." If you are close to God, you are conscious of practical things: as well as saying your prayers you also help with the washing up.

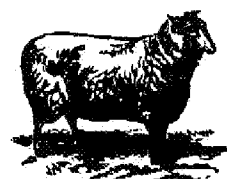

The Scottish Church

By HUBERT FENWICK

THE WORDS "SCOTTISH Church" have a curiously unreal ring about them, at least in Scotland, for there are two Scottish Churches, the historic Episcopal Church, founded by St. Ninian in the days of Imperial Rome; which was dis-established and dis-endowed in 1690, at the time of "Williamanmary" — and the Kirk, or Church of Scotland, which is Presbyterian and was founded by Andrew Melville in Jacobean times.

Recent attempts to bring the two branches together again, for they were once united, have so far failed, but the will is there, plus the necessity; and no doubt a re-union will eventually be effected. After all we have the example of South India before us, and one of the Bishops of that United Church is Leslie Newbiggin, a Scots Presbyterian!

Ecclesia Scoticana

Until the Reformation of 1560, the Quatercentenary of which falls this year, there was actually an "Ecclesia Scoticana," allied to Rome, under the direct protection of the Pope, who, believe it or not, was our guarantee against England and our champion against the claims of successive Archbishops of York!

This very Scottish Church unfortunately became corrupt, and was swept away in a hurry, too great a hurry in the opinion of many, by John Knox and his powerful Baronial followers. They were loudly and violently aided and abetted by what Master Knox himself called, "the rascally mob." A form of Calvinism,

but with Lutheran and Anglican features, was substituted. The Christian Calendar was abolished and the Sacraments reduced. Bishops were retained, under the name of Superintendents, and the King Edward VI Book of Common Prayer was introduced into Scotland from England.

This new Kirk bore practically no relationship to the Presbyterian Establishment that subsequently followed, and not much to the Episcopalian Establishment which was later restored.

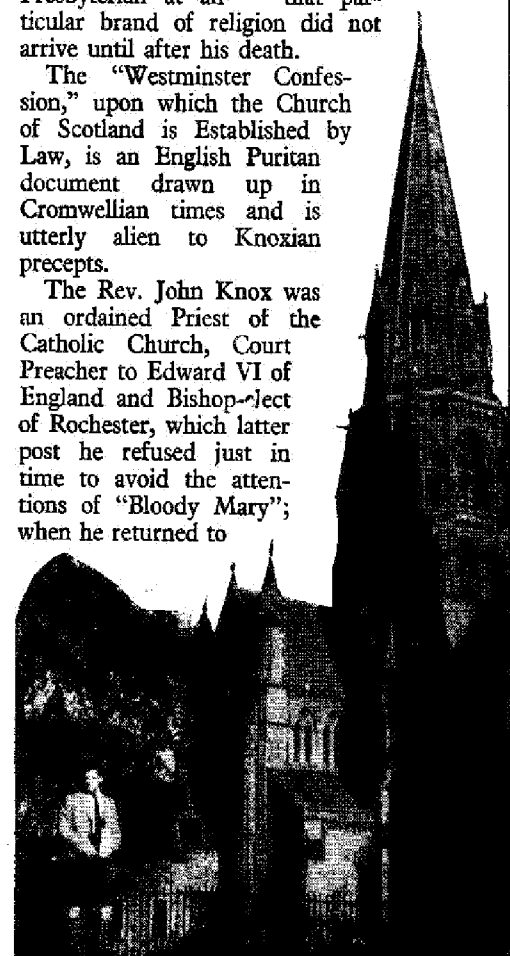
What Reformation?

This Knoxian Reformation rightly or wrongly, and almost certainly illogically, is being celebrated by Presbyterians here in Scotland this year. It is illogical, because Knox was not a Presbyterian at all — that particular brand of religion did not arrive until after his death.

The "Westminster Confession," upon which the Church of Scotland is Established by Law, is an English Puritan document drawn up in Cromwellian times and is utterly alien to Knoxian precepts.

The Rev. John Knox was an ordained Priest of the Catholic Church, Court Preacher to Edward VI of England and Bishop-elect of Rochester, which latter post he refused just in time to avoid the attentions of "Bloody Mary"; when he returned to

Edinburgh, built in the 1870s.

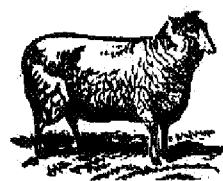

festival because I feel that its observance leaves much to be desired. Because it is no longer a general holiday, Ascension Day passes almost unnoticed by the man in the street. He would, I feel, take more notice of it if professing Christians themselves observed the festival as the Church intends. It is meant to be kept in high honour — it stands in the same rank with Christmas, Easter and Whit Sunday. It is perhaps of some advantage that Ascension Day is not specially marked in the civil calendar, if only to vest the religious sense and the obligation of worship felt by Christian people. It may not be generally known that the law allows all parents who wish to do so, to withdraw their children from attendance at school on Ascension Day, that they may fulfil their religious obligations.

Of course, Ascension Day and its implications make difficulties for our imaginations, which are at best very limited, especially in matters concerned with heaven. Each year the Church leads us from the Manger to the Mount. And now on Ascension Day we have come to the end of our journey, as it were. In this life we can go no farther. Like the disciples we are left gazing into the unseen. A cloud hides Jesus from our earthly sight. Always before us is a cloud. What they imagine lies beyond is a cause of fear to many people. There are others, the most pessimistic, who would have us believe that there is nothing beyond. But we Christians gaze into the cloud with faith. It must be so if we believe in a Risen Lord and accept His promises, for Jesus said—"In My Father's house are many mansions . . . I go to prepare a place for you". We believe that He ever liveth, and that beyond the mystery which bounds life's scene, beyond the cloud, there is One Who lives and reigns, and the end is with Him, for He is Lord of all.

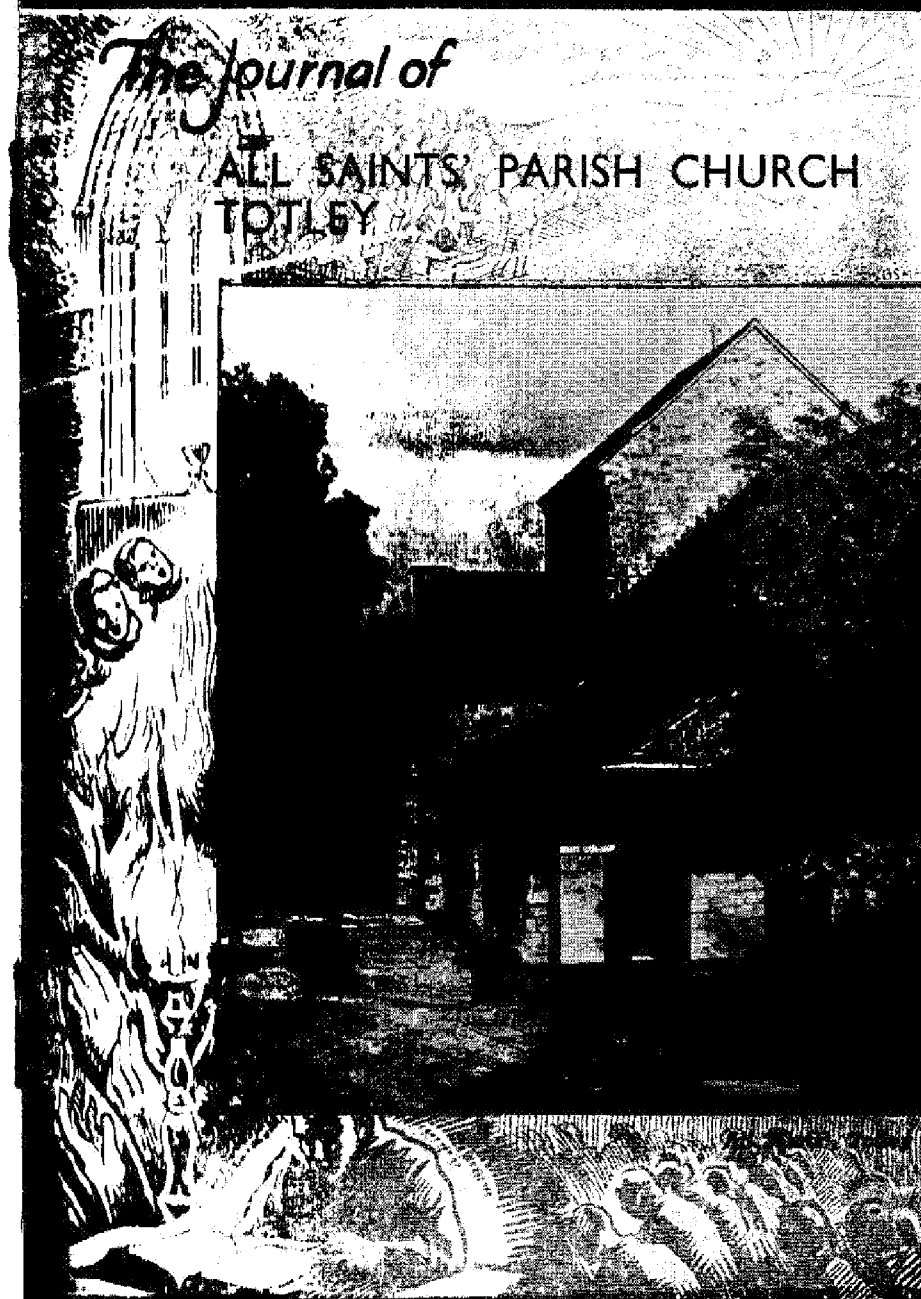

My dear Friends,

You know it's all a bit of a swindle and most disappointing. For many weeks now I have washed my face with a well-known brand of soap, and no one has told me I am a little lovelier each day. What is more, I don't believe I am—I can't even kid myself. Maybe I didn't quite understand what the gentleman said about it costing nine guineas an ounce to do the trick. If he meant nine guineas for every ounce of me—well, the game isn't worth the candle. Perhaps I am one degree under. In that case a churchyard voice has informed me often enough what I must do to put the matter right. Of course, I have been told often enough what it is that fortifies the over-forties—but I am growing a little wary. Perhaps I should consult a queer-looking doctor with an unpleasant squeaky voice; but I have watched him turn himself into a telephone—or was it some drink or other?, and I have no confidence in him. It is all so very disconcerting. I have heard so many voices. They all tend to yell at me and tell me that I ought to do this or do that. There must be few homes where there is not a box with a glass front in which one may see moving pictures and variety shows; talking pictures indeed; and broad are the jokes and wide is the range, and many there be that gape thereat. Few people cultivate silence in these days. We are all but compelled to hear voices all round us from early morn till dewy eve. It is an age of noise. Since there are no indications that the sounds will die down and the voices be hushed, it is the more needful that we should hear the advice of Jesus as it is given in the Gospel: "Take heed how ye hear: Take heed what ye hear".

I am not suggsting that we ought not to hear the voices that are continually speaking to us from radio and television, from cinema screen and hoarding, from newspapers and in common conversation. We cannot really help hearing nor does Jesus forbid us to hear but He is concerned with the *quality* of our hearing—how well or how imperfectly we hear.

Primarily our Lord was thinking of the word of God. God is always speaking to us, but do we give Him undivided or sustained attention? Do we listen critically, which of course means, do we ponder His word that we may be sure we have understood it and accepted its truth? When He speaks to us do we just hear what we want to hear and turn a deaf ear to Him when He challenges us to sacrifice and service?

God is ever speaking to us. He speaks to us through Nature. We can walk abroad in this fair earth which He has made and the more we know of His divine handiwork the more surely we shall know that God is communicating Himself to us

Christian Marriage

MARRIAGE IS, OF COURSE, as old as the race, and from earliest times man has established customs and ceremonies in connection with it.

Christianity began when "the Word was made flesh," and it has been a part of the genius of Christianity to lift and ennoble all natural things. We believe intensely in the sacramental character of marriage—as a natural thing which is transformed by the touch of God, and as one of the ways in which God makes Himself known in the world.

The marriage service carries more than the rite by which two persons are united: it carries also the Christian philosophy of marriage. It is "holy matrimony" in which they are to be joined. It is an "honourable

estate." It was "instituted of God." It signifies to us "the mystical union that is betwixt Christ and His Church." And St. Paul commends it as being "honourable among all men." It would be difficult to think of a higher conception of marriage than this.

Then the service goes on, "and therefore is not by any to be entered into unadvisedly or lightly; but reverently, discreetly, advisedly, soberly, and in the fear of God." Here is set forth the frame of mind in which marriage is to be undertaken. The three points seem to be: *seriousness*, which considers how important a step marriage is; *wisdom*, which looks all round the picture before taking the step; and *faith*, which acts in this great matter only with the approval and help of God.

Young People's Page

Dear You,

As you will have gathered from what I said last month, there has been a certain amount of discussion about this page—what it's like, what it ought to be like, and so on.

One thing has come out. The Editor, who is a very good friend of mine, said in his last letter to me that he felt that this page was "rather a sermonette month by month" and this shook me properly. I looked up "sermonette" in the dictionary, and it means, as I thought, "A little sermon," and a sermon means—well, you look it up. But I guess it doesn't sound very much like me!

I've been asking you for the last couple of months "What sort of person are you?" and I suppose it's only fair to give you a true come-back and tell you what sort of person I am.

To start with, I'm not all that much older than you—not as old as some of you because I happen to know that a number of not - young - people read our page, and they're very welcome (aren't they?)—remember, I threw it at you last month, it's your page!). I've brown hair and blue-grey eyes (why couldn't they have been one or the other?) and I'm very slim; I like bright lipsticks and high-heeled shoes and would adore to spend lashings of money on clothes if I had it, which I haven't.

I read a lot—practically anything from American magazines, which somebody lends me, and "Girl," which somebody else lends me, to things like Vladimir Lossky's "The Mystical Theology of the Eastern Church" when I can get it out of the Library which I haven't managed to do yet! And almost everything else in between, with a reservation about books which are definitely depressing because you can easily enough get depressed in this world without reading a book to induce depression and make an orgy of it!

I'd go to the theatre and the cinema more often if I had more money—the theatre is one of my first loves, when I left school I went to a stage-training school. I listen to the radio in patches, and I don't have television. I believe that "the chief end of man is to glorify

God and to enjoy Him for ever", though I don't always act as though I do, to my shame be it said.

If you get a kind of religious mania, it's not going to help you a lot. But loving God, and doing what He wants, is a very different thing. I find that hanging on to the love of God even when you feel you can't find Him and that I'm just talking rot, does help.

And when I say, as I do over and over again, that if you love God, and want to serve Him, He will help you, I'm not preaching a sermon, and I'm not talking in that remote, other-worldly way which some adults sometimes use. I say it because I know that when I have the wit to act like I believe, it works.

There are times when we're happy—terribly happy. And that's what God wants us to be. The happiness God wants for us is not just a nice feeling in Church, though going to Church comes into the joy of knowing Him, but He is, I'm sure, glad when you're happy at a dance (I can't dance—I've defeated all teachers) or just sitting on the floor listening to TOP TWENTY in the fire-light, if it's Winter, or swimming or picnic-ing or whatever now.

June is a month for weddings, and that's one of the happiest occasions, leading on, if you get it into the right proportion, to a life-time of happiness, if you

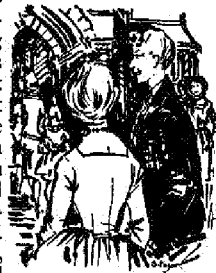
two share your new life with God. Lots of people who were married in June long past can tell you more about that than I can—your parents or your grandparents maybe.

through Nature. He speaks to us in the Bible. He would have us read it carefully and prayerfully, and as we do so we may learn how men came to know Him and His purpose for them. Most surely He speaks to us in Jesus. If you find much of the Bible hard to understand, as well you may, then turn to the Gospels; read them through carefully and pause over each recorded saying of Jesus and ask what it may mean for you to-day. I believe that God speaks to us directly we are ready to hear Him. There are some people who sit quietly for half an hour or so each day just thinking about the hours that lie ahead, that they may know how God would have them use the time, and that they may lift their programme, so far as they know it, into His presence. A waste of time? Well, they tell me that they pass through the day calmly and without the irritation that so often beset them before they listened to God in this way. God speaks all right, but other voices may speak so loudly that we do not hear Him. How big a place does religion play in your life: in your home life, in your life at work or at school? How much thought do you give to seeking to know God and His purpose for you? Do you give Him as much time as, for instance, you give to cleaning the car? Only you can answer those questions—if you dare!

But of one thing I'm quite sure—life is richer for those who have learned to hear and to judge wisely what they will hear. But the full joy and purpose of life are known only to those who have heard God speak as He speaks in Jesus. He makes all the difference in life — so great a difference that those who have heard Him speak find it hard to describe their experience. One person describes it like this—

"Lord I was deaf, I could not hear
The thrilling music of Thy voice:
But now I hear Thee and rejoice,
And all Thine uttered words are dear".

We regret to record the deaths of two of our church members, Mr. W. Stansfield and Miss H. M. Short.

Mr. Stansfield was a man who had held many lay offices in the church including those of Churchwarden, member of the Parochial Church Council and Chorister. He was a convinced and convincing churchman who loved the dignity and beauty of the worship as offered in the Church of England. When, in his latter days, he was unable to attend Church and received the sacrament in his own house, it was soon observed that he had no need of a Prayer Book with which to follow the service—he knew it—every word of it—by heart! We think it was indicative of his character that he should have spent his working life in the service of others. People, to him, were not just numbers on a hospital admission card — they were individuals who needed help and consideration and such help and consideration they received in so far as it was in his power to provide. There are a good many people in this parish as well as in the rest of his hospital region who have cause to be grateful to him for the help he gave so freely when someone they loved was in need of speedy help and relief. He would have been the very last man to have laid claim to any great love for his fellow-creatures—indeed, so often he tried to cloak it under a manner which was full of that impish humour which he possessed in full measure. Apart from the services he rendered to his own church he did a great deal of “hidden” work for the church in Sheffield and we were delighted that such services should be recognised, in the unavoidable absence of the Bishop of Sheffield himself, by his sending two of his clergy to take part in the funeral service. We shall miss him. To his wife and daughters we extend our sincere sympathy.

Miss Short was an old lady of whom it may truly be said—she died “full of years”. When she lived here she was a most faithful communicant—peaceful and quiet in all her ways. As she lived, so she died — may God grant unto her the rest she deserves and comfort those who loved her best.

My dear Friends,

It was Napoleon who once said, "the British nation is a nation of shopkeepers". Had he lived today he could have called us with quite as much appropriateness, a nation of debtors. Science has completely changed the standard of life for us all. And in order to enjoy as quickly as possible the benefits of science with its various gadgets for service and entertainment in the home, the hire purchase scheme comes to our aid by encouraging us, often unwisely, to purchase now and pay later. And one fact is evident without a doubt—that we have become a nation of debtors.

There is, however, a deeper meaning to this phrase that "we are debtors", and a very solemn thought it is. Think of those things that money cannot buy. We call them the simple things of life. The moving landscape that stirs the very depths of our being, good health, a real home, love and happiness. These are God's gifts which no money can buy. St. Paul was right when he referred to himself, and indeed to us all, as great debtors. I suppose that is why we give so willingly and generously when the need arises and our hearts are touched. It is because, deep down inside us, we realise that we have received so much. We are at the receiving end of the line—a fact which we dare not forget. When, for example, the season of Christmas comes round once more, it is this spirit that fills our hearts and we are glad to give, remembering that we are debtors to Jesus Christ for coming into this world to show us the way of life and to teach us how to live a life of goodness and happiness.

It is high time that we took more care in choosing between the evil and the good, and between the things that are of value and those that are worthless. We ought to learn to discriminate as our Lord taught us when He said "Lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt; and thieves do not break through and steal". And how appropriate to our generation are those words of Isaiah—

A profound parable of Our Lord, which is deserving our thought and study.

THE KINGDOM OF HEAVEN is likened unto a man who sowed good seed in his field. But while men slept, his enemy came and sowed tares . . . The servants said "Let us root up the tares" . . . but he said, "Nay, lest ye root up also the wheat with them. Let both grow together until the harvest." So runs Christ's parable. (St. Matthew, chap. 13, vv. 24 and following.)

The Uncomfortable Truth

Here is a truth, an uncomfortable truth, about all life, both in the world of nature and in the world of men. Here is stated quite bluntly and accepted by our Lord a problem which worries so many people and often makes them lose faith in God. For the argument goes—if there were a good God there wouldn't be floods and blights and pests and wickedness and

pernicious and the true, the frightening and the favourable.

So it is. So our Lord accepted it. So is the way of God.

The Struggle and The Choice

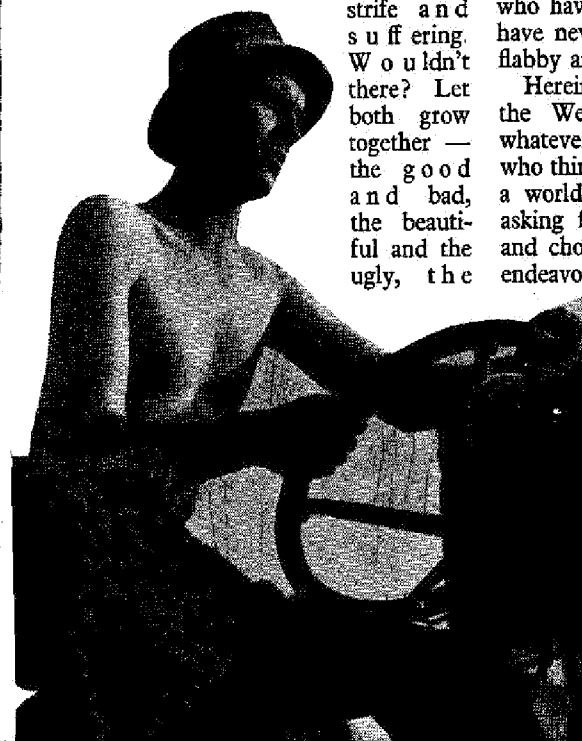
And see—if man is to rise to full stature there must be both the struggle and the choice. One of the great reasons why Christ still holds men in His thrall is because we can observe in Him the facing and overcoming in a struggle against all the evils men can bring forth. We can observe in Him the hard choice—"not to do my own will but the will of Him that sent me"—and winning through. What, indeed, would Jesus have been but for the struggle and the choice? A very diminished person indeed.

And what would we be but for the struggle and the choice? How often have we seen and known those persons who have never had to struggle, who have never had to decide—weak and flabby and effete.

Herein is one of the real dangers of the Welfare State and prosperity, whatever its many benefits. And those who think God should present us with a world of right and perfection are asking for a world where challenge and choice, struggle and striving and endeavour have no place or meaning. But that is not God's world. "Let both grow together until the harvest."

And this is true not only of the good earth, of the world in general and of human nature. It is true also of the Kingdom of

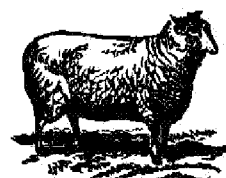
