The Vicar writes:

GOD AND THE HUMAN DRAMA

Democracy is something we all take for granted in our country, but obviously this is not so in many parts of the world. In countries of the Communist block, and many of the new nations of Africa and Asia, people can still be arrested and imprisoned without trial, and we in Britain look on rather helplessly while freedom and justice are denied to many millions of people. During the coming year Rhodesia will be in the headlines, and politically it presents a very difficult problem. The events of the past year have the atmosphere of a Greek tragedy-there seems to be an inevitability about the way in which the history of that country is developing. The Greek dramatists used to avert tragedy by introducing a god into the workings of the plot, and whatever our opinions may be about the right or wrong of the way in which the crisis in Rhodesia is being handled it is clear that only the realisation of the oneness of all men in Christ will make possible a multi-racial democratic society.

I hope that all of you will pray for the Church in Rhodesia; for the Christian men and women who can bring God into the drama of the political situation, and avert a tragedy.

Christian men and women must never forget that no matter how rich, how wise, how foolish, how illiterate, how vulgar a man may be, he is loved by our Lord, and has a potential to love as our Lord loved. The realisation of God's kingdom on earth means the binding together of all men into one body of the Church.

SYNODICAL GOVERNMENT

In the next few months we shall hear a lot about re-organising the government of the Church of England. The proposal of the Hodson Commission must be judged not only in terms of whether they will make our government more efficient, but also whether it will make clearer to every member of the Church our oneness in the Body of Christ. We must see beyond our parish boundaries, beyond the deanery and diocese, to where we see the Church as the whole people of God—bishop or layman, black or white, yellow or brown, rich or poor, clever or ignorant.

PEOPLE NEXT DOOR

During the early part of 1967 many of you will be taking part in "The People Next Door" discussion, which has been arranged by the British Council of Churches, and which it is hoped will take place in our homes. It will be practical; it will bring together Anglicans, Methodists, Roman Catholics and Congregationalists — people from many denominations—so that we can discover for ourselves the fulness of our oneness in Christ. We shall speak with more authority about the reconciling love of God in Christ, when we experience it in the life of the Church in our own land.

We can make 1967 a Happy New Year if we bring God into the drama of our human relationships.

A NEW SCHOOL

At the meeting of the Church Council on December 13th the Vicar reported that the Diocesan Council of Education had unanimously decided to back the proposal of the School Managers and the Church Council to build a new (Aided) Middle School to serve the neighbourhood. The Managers will now be able to begin official negotiations with the Local Education Authority.

CANON O'NEILL

The Vicar spoke of the great debt which the parish, and the whole of the diocese, owes to Canon O'Neill, the retiring Diocesan Director of Education, whose management of the affairs of Church Schools has made it possible for the Diocesan Council of Education to support the parish in the expansion of Church School education in Totley.

NEW MANAGER

Mrs. Muriel Snazell was elected by the Council as a School Manager for the next three years, in place of Mr. Ernest Coleman, who wishes to retire. Mr. Coleman had served as a School Manager since 1947, and has seen the plans the Managers prepared for a new Church School, brought to fruition.

The Council approved the budget for 1967.

On behalf of the Church Council, the Vicar thanked the Totley Scout Troop, and in particular Mr. Derek Maltby. for their gift of a very fine Notice Board. The Council also thanked the Ladies' Clubs for the gift of £20 to the Parish Hall Appeal.

The children's Christmas Play will be presented at 2.30 p.m. on January 1st, and the Christmas Party will be on January 7th from 3.30 to 6 p.m.

We congratulate Mr. Tinsdeall and members of the School staff on the School Play and Carol Service which raised £16.10.0. The Play was produced by Mr. W. Morgan, the Deputy Headmaster, and he would like to thank the parents of the children for their kind co-operation. This sum has been sent, at the request of the children, to the Overseas Development Fund for famine relief in Bihar.

The School children also helped to entertain senior members of the parish who were guests of the Mothers' Union at their party on December 13th.



The Vicarage, Totley

There is a Roumanian called Mindru Katz, who is known to music lovers throughout the world as one of the most superb artistes. He was born in 1922, and at the age of six-reminiscent of the child Mozart — had given his first public performance. At eight he was admitted to the Royal Academy of Music at Bucharest, and graduated from there as composer and conductor with first class honours. When he was eighteen, World War II changed his life of music and study to one of forced labour in a camp under cruel oppression. For five years he received the harshest treatment, and the hands that had made audiences throughout Europe acclaim him as one of the greatest pianists of all time were now blistered, scarred and cracked. It was a brutal experience for anyone, but all the more for a sensitive youth trained in the arts. Yet his spirit had a wonderful resource and these are his own words-

"By continuously filtering through my mind the many musical scores I had known before, I could ignore the nature of the work and keep going".

That secret saved his sanity and his gifts. Soon he was to play again at concerts all over Europe, including London, and the crowds acclaimed him as the most gifted and exciting of the post-war pianists. This all stemmed from his training in the formative years of childhood.

The mind that is stored from childhood with the great and glorious truths of the bible (even though the depth of them is hardly understood at the time) will stand the test when it comes. Where is there a better investment to be found than in our Church School and Sunday School? I beg of you to hold them in your prayers and interest. I count it one of my greatest privileges to be Vicar of a parish which possesses a Church School, and look forward to going in at least once a week to share with the children in their morning assembly and eventually to teach in one or two classes. Whether or not you have children of Primary School age, I ask you—as good Church people—to take an active interest in the welfare of our Church School, and to support the splendid work which the headmaster and staff are doing to see that our children get adequate training for the future and — not least — that they are well schooled in the Church's teaching. I also commend to you our Sunday School, which meets at 2.30 p.m. in church for a short service before the children go to their classes. If you have children between the ages of 4 and 11 I do hope you will make sure that they are not denied this opportunity of deepening their knowledge of the Church's teaching and the faith of Christ. Paul reminded Timothy of his Christian home and heritage (2 Timothy, chapter 3, verse 15 — "Remember that from early childhood you have been familiar with the sacred writings which have power to make you wise and lead you to salvation through faith in Christ Jesus". Surely what was good enough for Paul and Timothy is good enough for us in 1967.

Whilst I am on the subject of Christian education, since my arrival here I have had several enquiries about Confirmation classes, and I hope that it will not be long before I can make definite arrangements for training to begin, to lead up to a Confirmation Service, probably towards the end of 1968.
